Relations with Home-Schooled Students

The District recognizes the rights of parents¹ to educate students at home and acknowledges the Education Service district's role in registering and monitoring test results for students who are being taught at home.

The Board chooses not to provide dual enrollment to students who are involved in home schooling. It does not anticipate granting high school credit for home schooling or granting diplomas to home-schooled students who reside within the District.

Parents who elect home schooling options are encouraged to pursue GED or community college diploma alternatives.

Home-schooled students may participate in interscholastic activities if the following criteria is met:

- 1. The student is in compliance with all rules governing home schooling and can provide acceptable documentation of compliance to the District;
- 2. The student can meet the District eligibility requirements except the District or class attendance requirements;
- 3. The student need not meet class requirements of the voluntary association administering the interscholastic activities:
- 4. The student can achieve the minimum achievement test score required annually of home-schooled students (student may participate while awaiting test results);
- 5. The student must fulfill the same responsibilities and standards of behavior and performance including related class or practice requirements of other students participating in the interscholastic activity. The students must meet the same standards for acceptance on the team or squad. The student must also comply with all public school requirements during the time of participation;
- 6. The student must reside in the attendance boundaries of the school for which the student participates.

¹As used in this policy, the term parent includes legal guardian or person in a parental relationship. The status and duties of a legal guardian are defined in ORS 126.003 - 126.095. The determination of whether an individual is acting in a parental relationship, for purposes of determining residency, depends on the evaluation of the factors listed in Policy GBH. The determination for other purposes depends on evaluation of those factors and a power of attorney executed pursuant to ORS 126.030.
